This course aims to introduce the students to major aspects of Chinese languages, and enable them to relate and apply their general linguistic knowledge to an innovative analysis of structures of Chinese at different linguistic levels, namely, important issues of the sound system, word structure, and sentence structure of the Chinese languages from both synchronic and diachronic perspectives.

	Special emphasis is placed on topics

	compounds based on syntactic and semantic	
	relationships.	
	Key concepts in the sentence structures of	
	the Chinese languages will be introduced.	
	Special emphasis is placed on topics	
	including characteristics of Chinese word	
CILO2-4	order, grammatical words, and compounds.  Tutorial	
CILO2-4	A number of tutorial groups will be formed.	
	Each group is responsible for an oral	
	presentation with a written report on an	
	academic article. Students will have to be	
	well prepared for each session and give	
	feedback on fellow students' presentations.
