SS5798

Students of the part-time/combined study mode are required to take SS5798. The normal duration of the course is 2 semesters (Semester A & Semester B). The maximum extension duration of the course is 3 semesters (Summer term, Semester A & Semester B). After which no further extension is permitted. Each semester is charged 3 credits and summer term is charged 1 credit.

Students of the full-time study mode are required to take SS5798B. The normal duration of the course is 2 semesters (Semester B & Summer). The maximum extension duration of the course is 1 semester (Semester A). After which no further extension is permitted. Each semester is charged 3 credits.
