Scholarship for Outstanding Student Athletes in Distance Running

Regulations

The Scholarships funded by the Trustees of the Universe Running Institute Educational Trust have been established with effect from the 2013/14 academic year. The following regulations shall apply as of 2024/25:

1. There shall be a maximum of HK\$25,000 for a number of Individual Awards:

Names of Awards	Amount (HK\$)	No. of Awards
a) Most Valuable Athlete	\$4,500 each	1 male and 1 female
b) Most Potential Athlete (for new members)	\$4,000 each	1 male and 1 female
c) Most Progressive Athlete	\$4,000 each	1 male and 1 female

- 2. The selection criteria for each award are as follows:
 - a) Most Valuable Athlete/Most Potential Athlete (for new members) are to be selected by the team managers and coaches based on the performance of runner(s) in the Cross Country Race, organized by the University Sports Federation of Hong Kong (USFHK) of the academic year.
 - b) Most Progressive Athlete shall be offered to student(s) who have shown the biggest improvement in their running results in comparison to (i) the USFHK Cross Country Race last year and/or (ii) CityU regular team training.
- 3. All Individual Awards shall be awarded to full-time student athletes who have obtained satisfactory academic performance with a CGPA of 2.0 or above in a CityU programme.
- 4. Nominations shall be made by the managers and coaches of CityU Cross Country Team, and winners of the awards shall be selected by the Selection Panel chaired by the Associate Director (Physical Education) of Student Development Services and/or his delegate(s) by May of each academic year.
- 5. All eligible nominees can only be awarded one of the above-mentioned scholarships in each academic year.
- 6. The Awards shall be presented at the CityU Sports Team Annual Prize Presentation Ceremony cum Team Gathering.

Remarks:

With an objective to nurture our students and to promote caring culture, the University encourages each award recipient to make an annual donation of HK\$200 or more to the City University of Hong Kong for student support via CityU Alumni Giving Club when they are in employment after graduation. This term has been incorporated into all scholarship/prize/award/bursary schemes since February 2008.
