COMBATING CYBERCRIME: INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION AND CHINA'S EXPLORATION

Abstract

In the realm of criminal proceedings, a nation's enforcement jurisdiction is strictly confined within its own borders. Today, the cross-border nature of elements such as personnel, activities, tools, and funds involved in cybercrime has become increasingly prominent. This intensifies the need for international cooperation mechanisms among countries to effectively combat cybercrime. This lecture aims to analyze the practical challenges faced by traditional criminal justice in tackling cybercrime, introduce the current institutional efforts of the international community in combating cybercrime, and discuss China's adaptations of its domestic laws and contributions to the construction of international regulations in response to the globalized nature of cybercrime.

Prof. dr. Wei PEI, faculty member of Beihang University Law School (BHLS) and director of the Digital Justice Research Center at Beihang University. Prior to joining the BHLS faculty, Pei conducted PhD research at the Erasmus School of Law of the Erasmus University Rotterdam, the Netherlands. Prof. Pei is a council member of the Cyber and Information Law Research Association, the Criminal Procedure Law Research Association, and the Comparative Law Research Association of the China Law Society. Her research interests include digital criminal justice, personal data protection, digital evidence, and cybercrime.
